Town of Lincoln, New Hampshire PUBLIC LOITERING ORDINANCE


A person commits a violation if he knowingly appears at a place, or at a time, under circumstances that warrant alarm for the safety of persons or property in the vicinity (RSA 644:6)


No person or persons shall loiter on any street or sidewalk or public parking area or public park after closing hours, within the Town of Lincoln, in such a manner as to impede pedestrian traffic on said street, sidewalk, public parking area or public park, or impede ingress or egress to or from the entrance of any business establishment, apartment building or private home adjacent to such street, sidewalk, public parking area or public park.


Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a first offense, and not less or more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each subsequent offense.
